15.	Has the company reviewed Centers for Disease Control (CDC) strategies for minimizing potential risk of exposure to all employees?					
16.	Has the company reviewed OSHA strategies for minimizing potential risk of exposure to all employees?					
17.	Are an appropriate number of workers on the worksite trained in First Aid and CPR?					
18.	Are workers who utilize chemicals trained on the requirements of OSHA's Hazard Communication?
